Today the Church celebrates Gaudete Sunday as we draw closer to the birthday of our Lord. The readings we have at Mass shift in their focus. Unlike the beginning of Advent, where the focus is on the final coming of our Lord, we are now presented with the readings that anticipate His birthday.

The liturgical color of Gaudete Sunday is rose. The rose color is a symbol of hope and marks the beginning of the second phase of Advent. On the 17th of December the Church begins even more proximate preparation as the famous "O Antiphons" are recited at Evening Prayer. The banners we have in the link represent each of the antiphons. Most people would know these antiphons as the advent hymn "O Come, O Come Emmanuel." Each of the verses of the hymn is a different antiphon.

The subtle progressions in our liturgical celebrations are meant to heighten our anticipation of the Lord's coming. May we all approach Christmas with expectant hearts and be ready for the tremendous graces the Lord seeks to give us on His birthday!

GIFTS FROM YOUR IRA

Persons age 70 or older can support St. Thomas Aquinas Parish by making a tax-free gift donation directly from their IRA. If you have wished to make a charitable contribution from your IRA, changes in the tax law now permit you to do so within certain guidelines.

If you are 70 or older, you may make a contribution directly from your IRA to St. Thomas Aquinas during the calendar year 2009. The maximum gift is limited to \$100,000 but the gift may be made in cash or appreciated property. Even though Minimum Required Distributions have been suspended for 2009, a charitable gift directly from your IRA to St. Thomas Aquinas will not be considered taxable income to you and therefore will not increase your tax bracket. You will not be able to deduct the gift as a charitable contribution on your 2009 income tax return. However, because these gifts do not fall under normal deduction rules, you can make gifts in excess of 50% of Adjusted Gross Income limitation for cash gifts.

Confer with your tax advisor and consult your IRA custodian concerning the details of making an IRA gift to the Parish.
